SUMMER LANGUAGE ARTS ACTIVITIES

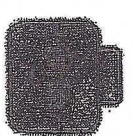
1. Reading Race – Have your child practice fluency skills by timing your child for one minute as he/she reads a familiar passage. Repeat and see if he/she can complete the passage faster. Or have your child slow down to read for expression.
2. Create a reading time with your family. Have each member take turns reading.
3. Have your child design a bookmark to use during the summer.
4. Have your child keep a review of books read during the summer on index cards. They may share some when we return to school.
5. Have your child watch favorite t.v. show and write a note to retell parts of the show: beginning, middle, and ending:
6. If you get a newspaper, have your child collect comic strips from the newspaper. Clip them together and read. Have your child make up new comic strips.
7. Let your child make lots of lists: Favorite toys, movies, books, animals, pets, foods, places to visit, etc.
8. Have your child cut out pictures from newspapers/magazines. Have your child write a caption for the pictures.
9. Allow your child to dress up as a character in a book and act out parts of the story for family and friends.
10. Have your child play a board game. Ask him/her to read the directions aloud before playing the game.
11. Have your child practice reading skills this summer by reading and retelling. Have your child read a book and illustrate the text by using chalk on a sidewalk.
12. Build a tent with chairs and blankets. Have your child grab a book and read inside.
13. Have your child practice writing skills by keeping a journal or by sending letters, notes, or emails to relatives
14. Build an indoor beach. Get some towels, a glass of lemonade, and a book. Read while relaxing on your beach.
15. Eat and Chat – allow books at the table and have your child share parts of the text while munching. Make sure there are no crumbs left on the book☺

Places to visit in Pennsylvania

Peddler's Village - Lahaska

Rice's Flea Market - New Hope (not as it once was, but still may be worth a trip.)

Dilly's at Centre Bridge - New Hope - (Old-fashioned take-out)

Pennsbury Manor - William Penn's Country House - in Lower Bucks near Levittown

Tyler State Park - (Between Richboro and Newtown) I grew up right down the road from this park and spent many days at a beautiful covered bridge (Schofield Ford Bridge) It was rebuilt in the 90's after a fire.

Pioneer Tunnel Coal Mine - This is where we (normally) go on our class trip. It is near the town of Centralia (well, it is no longer considered a town) where there has been an underground mine fire since 1962. (Amazingly, it is said that it could burn for another 100 years.)

Shankweiler's Drive-In - Orefield

Jim Thorpe - Beautiful town - known as the "Switzerland of PA" due to the mountains surrounding the town.

Grand Theater - East Greenville

Lost River Caverns - Hellertown

Hoover - Mason Trestle Walkway - One of my favorite places!! - At SteelStacks in Bethlehem

National Museum of Industrial History - Right near SteelStacks

National Canal Museum - Easton - Learn about the canal and towpath that run along the Lehigh River.

Lancaster Area

Lititz - a supposedly picturesque town - (I have not been there)

Wolf Sanctuary of PA - Lititz

Bushkill Falls - Beautiful, but there is an entrance fee
